

# Child Custody & Access

"Custody" refers to decision-making, specifically, the authority to make important decisions regarding the child's future, including education, health care, religious upbringing, and major extracurricular activities. "Access" refers to a parent's right to have the children in his or her care for periods of time.

Parents may address child custody and access – broadly known as "parenting issues" – through negotiation, mediation, arbitration, or the court system.
