

Cohabitation Contracts

When a couple lives together in a marriage-like relationship but is not legally married, they also have certain legal rights. Much like a marriage contract, a cohabitation agreement, also known as a Domestic Contract, can determine potential property division, spousal support and other issues that may arise at the end of a cohabiting relationship, or set out expectations for during the cohabitation (such as how living expenses are split between the couple). Cohabitation agreements can transition to a marriage contract if the couple decides to marry at a later time.

To ensure that your rights are protected, it is important that agreements and contracts be properly drafted, as the law is very specific as to what constitutes a valid contract. It is essential that both parties to a cohabitation agreement obtain independent legal advice, or the agreement risks being invalidated.
