What are “no-fault” benefits?

Statutory Accident Benefits, also known as “no-fault benefits”, are the benefits available to you from your own insurance company, after you have been injured as a result of the use or operation of a motor vehicle, regardless of whether you were at fault for the accident.

Those who may be entitled to accident benefits include those who have been injured as a result of the use or operation of a motor vehicle, meaning that pedestrians and cyclists may also be entitled to receive benefits.

Here are some of the benefits you may be entitled to:

- Medical and Rehabilitation Benefits;
- Attendant Care Benefits;
- Income Replacement Benefits;
- Caregiver Benefits;
- Non-Earner Benefits;
- Visitor Expenses;
- Lost Educational Expenses; and
- Funeral or Death Benefits.
